

### Swopper Classic® microfiber

- Optimum care is ensured by using just water and pH neutral soapsuds. Stains containing oil and fat should be treated beforehand with ethyl alcohol.
- Rinse with clear water after each cleaning treatment. Never use chlorinated detergents.
- Only dampen the seat and never make it completely wet, otherwise the cushioning under the fabric might be damaged. Therefore use only very small amounts of water and detergent.
- Avoid marks by cleaning from the edge of the seat to the middle.

**Warning:** Benzene, acetone and the like might dissolve the foam material under the cover.

### Swopper Air® seat fabric

- You can remove most stains easily using lukewarm water if necessary with a little pH-neutral detergent. Always use a clean, white cotton cloth for this.
- Rinse with clear water after each cleaning treatment. Never use chlorinated detergents.
- Only dampen the seat and never make it completely wet, otherwise the cushioning under the fabric might be damaged. Therefore use only very small amounts of water and detergent.

**Warning:** Benzene, acetone and the like might dissolve the foam material under the cover.

### Swopper Saddle® leather cover

- If soiled, wipe with a soft, damp cloth, then rub down with a clean cloth.
- Treat subsequently with leather care products as required.

### standard upholstery:

Vacuum up any excess dirt/spillage with close attention to the seams, area where the seat meets the back and area where the arms meet the seat/back. After, take a lint-free cloth and dip it into any water-based cleaning agent. Scrub gently over the stained area. Repeat if needed. For best results, follow the mill guidelines for your exact textile.

### vinyl upholstery:

Use a bristle brush to gently loosen up the stain. Mix mild soap and warm water together and using a lint-free cloth, damp it a little bit into the mixture and scrub gently wherever the stain is located. Avoid using any detergents as it can cause the vinyl to change color or fade. For best results, follow the mill guidelines for your exact vinyl.

### leather upholstery:

Keep leathered upholstery out of direct sunlight so the material doesn't dry out and fade/crack.

Cleaning leather upholstery is easy and can be done in 3 different ways:

- rubbing alcohol and water,
- actual leather cleaner you find at a store (always test a small area first),
- vinegar and linseed oil.

Use a lint-free cloth. Damp it into your cleaning agent and gently scrub the stained area. Use a dry, lint-free cloth to dry the area. Repeat if needed. For best results, follow the mill guidelines for your exact textile.

### cleaning the foot ring

Dark marks left by the soles of shoes on the foot ring are best removed using a soft cloth with a drop of benzene.
